## Unit 1: Oso Pardo, Oso Pardo, ¿Qué ves Ahí?

Unit One goals: Students will:

- Identify animals from the story
- Identify numbers 1-10 (Numbers 1-20 are introduced)
- Count by ones from 1-10
- Identify colors from the story plus the colors orange and pink
- Respond to the questions:

How are you?
What is your name?

- Use greetings: hello, good day, good-bye (hola, buenos días, adios)
- Respond appropriately to essential classroom language directions;
- Levántense
- Siéntense
- Levanta la mano
- Hagan una fila
